EVOLUTION-

Developmental psychology concerned with exploring all aspects of human psychological development & change. In essence it is about all the sorts of psychological changes; changes in human behaviour, thoughts & feelings, that can occur between cradle & grave.³

It enables us to access the truth of a whole range of other common assertion about human.

Developmental psychology studies the patterns of growth & change occurring throughout life.⁴

Two main factors affecting development are-

1. Hereditary factors- these provide the potential for particular behaviour or traits & also place limitations on the emergence of such behaviour or traits.

2. Environmental factors are; parents, siblings, family friends, schooling, nutrition, socio-economical condition of family, culture surrounding & habits. These factors play a critical role in enabling people to reach those potential capabilities made possible by their genetic background.⁵

MIASM-

Definition

“A miasma is a dynamic but morbific power or polluting factor embedded in the inner constitutional fiber of a person and this stigma is passed on from generation to generation.”⁷

It is “an aggregation or collection of attributes, trials, qualities of an individual on the intellectual, mental & physical plane which is hereditary and also partly acquired through the patient’s life”.

Each human being is characterised by miasmatic modulation through which his individuality emerges in a constant sway.

The qualitative expression of a human being at the mental & physical level are solely determined by the miasma.⁹

Personality Shades



Each miasm give shape to the human constitution in their peculiar manner. In the healthy state; desires, aversion, physical make up, sleep etc. evolve & express due to fundamental miasm. Dominant or active miasm evolves & express in a disease condition.¹¹

There are many factors which are responsible for the production and the development of the disease & tendencies are most important predisposing factors for the production and the development of the disease conditions.

This predisposition, whether constitutional or merely constant aspect of organic man which persists in the form of its expression, was called by Dr. Hahnemann: miasm⁸.

Fundamental miasm-

Fundamental miasm remains dormant for long time environmental stressors can activate the basic miasm & it can be dominant or combine with the already influencing miasm to cause complex miasm¹².

Kohlberg has suggested that there are 3 levels & 6 stages of moral development.


- Pre-conventional morality
